e hope to provide a better coordinated and stronger Professional development program based on teacher - instructor needs. We have developed a number of ethno specific working groups, which we hope will provide relevant information on current needs.

Funding

An ongoing issue for schools is funding. The ESAV must over the next 12 months enter into meaningful negotiations to secure increased funding.

Costs are growing, schools are paying high amounts in rent, reimbursements to teachers are on the increase, quality assurance and other demands are increasing.

It would only be fair and reasonable that the program receive increased funding to cover many of these costs.

The rental issue continues to haunt all involved as it is difficult to find a solution.

We will be holding a number of consultations to examine cost structures, capability of schools and community to pay and the necessity of seeking increased per capita funding.

VCE LOTE

he ESAV believes that the current policy of suspending a VCE LOTE if a language does not have 15 students nationally should be changed. We are now seeing the real effects with 7 languages suspended and possibly more on the way.

This artificial magic number will have a great impact, as small candidatures fail to come up with the number.

The Ministerial Council on LOTE ESL and Multicultural Education (MACLEM) is currently investigating the matter. We will be forming a subcommittee to organise our participation in any moves to have this number removed.

COMMUNITY LANGUAGES SCHOOLS MEETINGS

SAV conducts community languages schools group meetings. All community languages schools are encouraged to participate.

These meetings examine a range of issues relating to community languages schools

They also provide us with the opportunity to share our experiences, outcomes and concerns.



Accountability for 2005 Per Capita Grant:

Must be submitted with Application for funding documents by 1 May 2006. Statements for grants over \$20,000 need to be audited by qualified accountant/s.

Public Liability Insurance:

2005 -2006 policy expires on 12 July 2006. The policy will be renewed at that time

Banking details:

Accreditation Beyond 2006:

New Accreditation guidelines have recently been forwarded to all Community Language Schools by DE&T. You are urged to carefully study them and get prepared for Reaccreditation of your school should you wish to continue receiving per capita funding by the DE&T.

Strong evidence was presented by Council members to highlight the positive work being undertaken at a local school, State at Territory Association and national levels. National coordination was identified as an important factor for this success.

Project Plan Department of Education, Science and Training (DEST) funded National Project on National Coordination and Quality Assurance in Ethnic Schools.




The Council analysed the Project Plan. Decisions were taken on localising the project to ensure stronger coordination. Issues relating to website management, professional development, teacher training and quality assurance issues were addressed. National coordination will lead to better outcomes at jurisdictional, local and school levels.

JOINT PROJECT

he Council endorsed a joint project - titled Young People as a Gateway - Ethnic Schools Partnership with Community Languages Australia and Ethnic Schools Associations.

The program will engage the use of language of parents and grandparents to enhance communication skills of students in discussing a very relevant and important - topic Quality use of medicines

ational Prescribing Service (NPS), the peak organisation providing independent information about medicines, and the Federation of Ethnic Communities' Councils of Australia (FECCA), the peak organisation representing ethnic communities across Australia, formed a partnership in 2004, to develop, implement and evaluate the Multicultural Community Quality Use of Medicines (MCQUM) Program, a community component of the overarching NPS Community Quality Use Medicines (QUM) Program funded by the Australian Government Department of Health and Ageing. The program approach is evidence based and uses a health promotion framework.

A and FECCA approached

Community Languages Australia
to participate in a national
project on promoting the quality use of medicines.

Schools will be offered background material and Community Languages Australia would develop a series of lesson plans for use in schools.
